What is ECHO COLORADO?



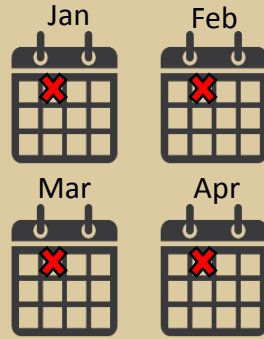

- reduce high cost of off-site trainings, and
- create a community of learners.

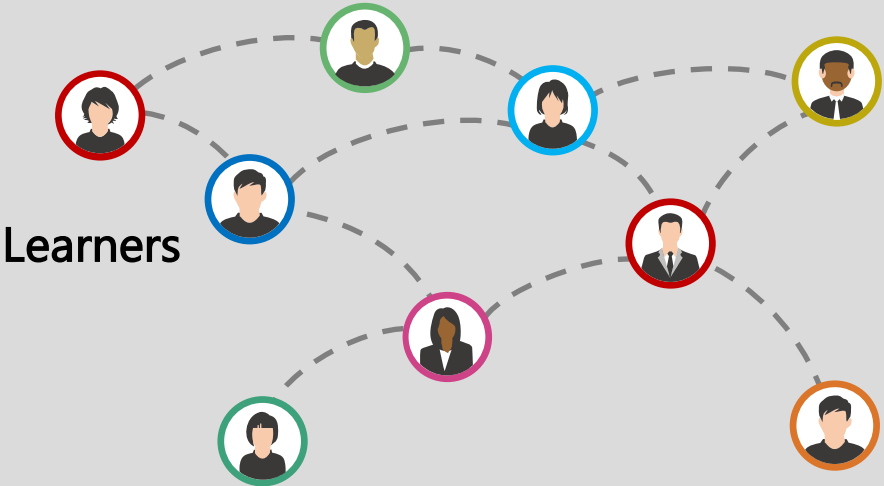
